Collect of the Day

Presider: Let us pray:

**All: Lord of the deep waters,
you call us from the safety of the shore
to an adventure of the Spirit:
open wide our arms to embrace the world
you dare us to serve;
through Jesus Christ your living Word. Amen.**

The First Lesson: Isaiah 6:1-8

Reader: The First Lesson is taken from the prophet Isaiah,

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ² Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³ And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.'

⁴ The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!'

⁶ Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷ The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' ⁸ Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Here endeth the First Lesson.

Gradual Psalm: 138

¹ I will give thanks unto thee, O LORD, with my whole heart: /
even before the gods will I sing praise unto thee.

² I will worship toward thy holy temple and praise thy Name,
because of thy loving-kindness and truth; /
for thou hast magnified thy Name and thy word above all things.

³ When I called upon thee, thou heardest me, /
and enduedst my soul with much strength.

⁴ ALL the kings of the earth shall praise thee, O LORD;/
for they have heard the words of thy mouth.

⁵ Yea, they shall sing of the ways of the LORD; /
for great is the glory of the LORD.

⁶ For though the LORD be high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly: /
as for the proud, he beholdeth them afar off.

⁷ Though I walk in the midst of trouble, yet shalt thou refresh me: /
**thou shalt stretch forth thy hand upon the fury of mine enemies,
and thy right hand shall save me.**

⁸ The LORD shall fulfil his purpose toward me: /
**Yea, thy mercy, O LORD, endureth for ever;
forsake not then the works of thine own hands.**

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost,
**As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,
World without end. Amen.**

The Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Presider: The Lord be with you,

All: and with thy Spirit.

Presider: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, ² he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' ⁵ Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.' ⁶ When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break.

⁷ So they signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸ But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' ⁹ For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.' ¹¹ When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.
